## INDEPENDENT PRACTITIONER'S REVIEW ENGAGEMENT REPORT

To the Board of Directors  
British Columbia Archery Association

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of British Columbia Archery Association that comprise the statement of financial position as at March 31, 2026, and the statements of operations and changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, as well as a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

### Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

### Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the accompanying financial statements based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements, which require us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements is a limited assurance engagement. The practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making inquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less in extent than, and vary in nature from, those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these financial statements.

### Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the financial statements do not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of British Columbia Archery Association as at March 31, 2026 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

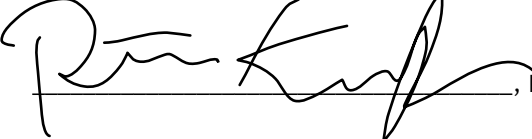

**PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION**

The British Columbia Archery Association was formed to perpetuate, foster, and manage the practice of archery and without limiting the generality of the foregoing; to adopt, interpret, and enforce rules for the practice of archery in all its forms; to hold annual tournaments for the purpose of determining the Champions for the British Columbia Archery Association; and to act in general as the supreme governing body in all matters that pertain to archery in the Province of British Columbia, Canada. The Association is registered under the Society Act of British Columbia and is not subject to income tax. The Association is not a registered charity under the Income Tax Act and therefore cannot issue charitable donation receipts.

**Note 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**a) Basis of Presentation**

The Association prepares its financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO).

**b) Use of estimates**

When preparing financial statements according to ASNPO, estimates and assumptions are made relating to reported amounts of revenue and expenditure, assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Assumptions are based on a number of factors, including historical experience, current events, actions that the Association may undertake in the future, and other assumptions that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Actual results could differ from those estimates under different conditions and assumptions. Estimates are used when accounting for certain items such as useful lives of capital assets and impairment of long-lived assets.

**c) Revenue recognition**

Revenue is recognized when earned, specifically when all the following conditions are met:

- There is clear evidence that an arrangement exists.
- Amounts are fixed or can be determined.
- The ability to collect is reasonably assured.

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when they are received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

**d) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents are comprised of cash and term deposits which are readily convertible to cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

**e) Contributed services**

Volunteers contribute significant hours per year to assist the Association in delivering its services. Because of the difficulty in determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

**f) Capital assets**

The capital assets are recorded at cost. Amortization is provided annually at rates and methods over the estimated useful lives as follows, prorated for the number of months of ownership. The estimates of the useful lives of the assets are reviewed every year and adjusted on a prospective basis, if needed.

Impairment of capital assets is reviewed whenever events or changes in the circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognized for the excess of the carrying value over the fair value of the asset, during the year the impairment occurred.

**Note 2 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS**

The Association's financial instruments consist of cash, accounts receivable, and accounts payable. Unless otherwise noted, it is the opinion of management that the Association is not exposed to significant interest, currency, or credit risks arising from these financial instruments. The fair value of the instruments approximates their carrying values, unless otherwise noted.

The Association initially measures its financial assets and financial liabilities originated or exchanged in arm's length transactions at fair value. Financial assets and financial liabilities originated or exchanged in related party transactions, except for those that involve parties whose sole relationship with the organization is in the capacity of management, are initially measured at cost. The cost of a financial instrument in a related party transaction depends on whether the instrument has repayment terms. The Association subsequently measures all its financial assets and liabilities at cost or amortized cost. Financial assets subsequently measured at amortized cost include cash, term deposits, accounts receivable and prepaid expenses. Financial liabilities measured at amortized cost include accounts payable.

**Note 3 CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS**

Included in cash and cash equivalents is a \$100,000 term deposit held at Prospera Credit Union, earning interest at 2.94%, maturing June 19, 2026. The fair value of the term deposit approximates the carrying value.

**Note 7 INTERNALLY RESTRICTED RESERVES**

Funds have been restricted internally by the Board of Directors to cover the salary of the Executive Director for one year should the position be dissolved. This reserve would allow for the continuation of the duties of this position until they are reallocated to volunteers. The total in this reserve is \$55,000.

Funds have been restricted internally by the Board of Directors for future tournament equipment expenditures. The total in this reserve is \$10,000.

## **Report of the Executive Director**

As I reflect on the past year, I am incredibly proud of everything that BC Archery has accomplished. It has been a year filled with growth, new experiences, exciting opportunities, and continued progress for our organization. I remain extremely grateful to

serve as Executive Director and to work alongside such a dedicated Board of Directors, volunteers, coaches, officials, clubs, and members.

The fall marked the beginning of one of the largest projects I have undertaken in archery—serving as the Provincial Advisor for the 2026 BC Winter Games in Trail-Rossland. This was my first opportunity to lead the planning of a major multi-sport event for our sport from start to finish and proved to be an invaluable learning experience. My responsibilities in collaboration with our VP-Athlete Development included selecting coaches, coordinating and monitoring zone trial events, selecting Zone teams, completing final participant registration and working closely with the BC Games Society to ensure our sport was well represented throughout the planning process.

As the Games approached, I stepped back from the full Provincial Advisor role, allowing Hailey Murray to step in as Assistant Provincial Advisor while I focused on coaching Team Zone 1. Having spent months working with and preparing these athletes, it was incredibly rewarding to support them throughout the competition. I was exceptionally proud of how well the archery competition was delivered and grateful to have been part of the Games from the earliest planning stages through to the final awards presentation.

Following the BC Winter Games, I had the opportunity to participate in ViaSport and Sport Law's Operational Enhancement Initiative. This comprehensive project reviewed BC Archery's governance structure, policies, bylaws, and operational practices. The resulting report has provided our organization with valuable recommendations that will help guide future improvements and strengthen our governance. I would like to extend a sincere thank you to our Director at Large and VP Administration for their significant support and dedication throughout this initiative.

This year also marked an exciting milestone with the redesign and rebranding of our Team BC jerseys. The new design provides a modern, professional appearance that better reflects BC Archery's identity and marketing direction. It has been wonderful to see our provincial athletes proudly representing British Columbia in this refreshed look.

Leading into the BC Indoor Championships, I coordinated event registration and assisted with target assignment. During the Championships in Victoria, I supported tournament operations, results compilation, medal presentations, and awards ceremonies. While in Victoria, our Board also held its

annual budget planning meeting to establish priorities for the coming year.

Working alongside our Director at Large, I also helped update the BC Archery Triple Crown Program. These changes better align the program with our strategic goals by encouraging participation in our provincial championships and creating greater value for athletes competing throughout the season.

One of the most rewarding aspects of this position continues to be building relationships throughout our archery community. Whether working with clubs, volunteers, athletes, officials, coaches, or partner organizations, I genuinely enjoy connecting with our members and hearing new ideas that help strengthen BC Archery. My goal remains to foster an organization that is welcoming, transparent, collaborative, and committed to continual improvement. Every year brings new lessons, and I continue to grow both professionally and personally in this role.

Outside of my Executive Director responsibilities, I have remained deeply involved in developing the sport at the grassroots level within my local community. Our Cranbrook Archery Club youth program welcomed nearly 130 young archers this year, introducing many families to the sport for the first time. I also hosted an archery "Try-It" booth at our local Pumpkin Fall Fair, providing another excellent opportunity to promote archery and encourage community participation.

Throughout the year I continued offering archery birthday parties, workplace team-building events, and private coaching lessons. During the summer, I hosted eight youth summer camp days, with nearly twenty participants attending each session. Watching these young athletes develop confidence, friendships, and a passion for archery continues to be one of the most rewarding parts of what I do.

My coaching journey also continued to grow this year. I was honored to coach Team Zone 1 at the BC Winter Games, where our athletes achieved multiple medal performances. I also completed my Officials Training during the BC Indoor Championships, expanding my understanding of tournament operations and further strengthening my ability to support events across the province. I have been very recreational in my own shooting, dabbling in a bit of barebow and still shooting some compound archery.

Another major highlight of the year was serving as the Host committee Event Lead for Canada Cup West in Cranbrook. Hosting a national event required extensive planning and coordination. I recruited and managed volunteers, secured venues, arranged food vendors, coordinated logistics, managed the field crew, and oversaw countless behind-the-scenes details necessary to deliver a successful competition. It was undoubtedly one of the largest and most trialing projects I have undertaken and an incredible learning experience that has expanded my skills in event management and national level competitions.

On a more personal note, my family experienced an exciting milestone this spring as we moved back to our home roots in Marysville (Kimberley, BC). It has been wonderful settling into our new home, and this fall our little boy will begin Kindergarten—a very exciting new chapter for our family.

As always, I remain committed to being a passionate advocate for archery and for BC Archery. I believe our greatest successes come through collaboration, open communication, and a willingness to embrace new ideas. I encourage every member, volunteer, and club to continue sharing their thoughts and working together as we shape the future of our organization.

Thank you to our Board of Directors, volunteers, officials, coaches, host clubs, athletes, sponsors, and

every member who contributes to making BC Archery such a strong and supportive community. It is truly an honor to serve as your Executive Director, and I look forward to another successful year ahead.

### **Report of the VP- Administration for BC Archery**

In my time as VP-Administration I have continued to support our directors as needed as they work on their action items for our Strategic Plan and Risk Registry, and I continue to sit on a number of Committees including the Coaching Committee, the Risk Management Committee, Strategic Planning Committee although we have not had many meetings. I took a Governance Primer Webinar in November. I also collaborated with our Executive Director and Director at Large to work with the people from Sport Law Group on ViaSport's Operational Enhancement Initiative where we reviewed BC Archery's Governance, Policies, and Procedures to optimize our organizational readiness.

In addition to my work in my role as VP Administration, I have been busy facilitating a few coaching clinics this year and evaluating and certifying instructors at both beginner and intermediate levels, and I have judged a local event in Richmond and both the Provincial Indoor and 3D Championships where I also mentored two judge candidates.

## **BC Winter Games- Provincial Advisor**

The 2026 BC Winter Games in Trail-Rosslund marked another successful milestone for archery and an exciting step forward for the sport. This was the first Games where two Provincial Advisors worked together throughout the planning and delivery of the event.
